

The Clarinda Foundation has the privilege of administering scholarship funds that have been established with the Foundation by individuals, families or organizations in order to provide financial assistance to those graduating seniors and post graduates that have chosen to further their educational training. On the evening of May 15<sup>th</sup> the Foundation awarded \$45,750 in scholarships to area graduating seniors. The Foundation will also provide \$18,000 in the form of renewable scholarships to past Borden scholarship recipients for an overall total of \$63,750 paid out in 2018 scholarships. Since 1991 the Foundation has awarded approximately \$503,000.

#### **VERNON J. BAKER EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP**

The Baker Scholarship fund was established by CHS faculty in the 1990's for the purpose of financially assisting outstanding CHS graduates in pursuit of their post-secondary education. ***The four \$1,000 scholarships were awarded to: Haley Bix; Maicy Darrah; Jace Morgenstern and Josie Nelson.***

#### **RALPH & GLADYS BORDEN SCHOLARSHIP**

Prior to Ralph Borden's death he made arrangements for the establishment of this scholarship fund which awards a renewable scholarship for up to 8 semesters of post-secondary education. All recipients of this scholarship are required to live within the boundaries of the former New Market School District. ***The \$3,000 scholarships were awarded to: Schyler Johnson of Bedford High School; Allison DeVoe and Abbie Guthrie of the Clarinda High School.***

#### **ETHEL BROCKMAN NURSING SCHOLARSHIP**

After Ethel's death in 1990 her husband Bill established this scholarship in her memory and to honor her forty-two years of outstanding work as a nurse at the Clarinda Hospital. The recipient of this scholarship is to pursue a degree in higher education with the intent to become a registered nurse. ***The \$750 scholarship was awarded to Haley Bix.***

#### **CLARINDA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP**

The Clarinda Foundation Scholarship is awarded based on a review of all scholarship applications received by the Clarinda Foundation. ***The \$1,000 scholarships were awarded to: Austin Gutknecht; Mariajose Guerrero; Anna Hull; and Daniel Lemus Sliger.***

#### **CLARINDA FOUNDATION AGRICULTURE AND ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP**

The Clarinda Foundation Agriculture and Engineering scholarship was established to provide tuition aid for the post-secondary education of a CHS graduating senior that plans to enroll in an accredited trade/vocational school, community college or university in the field of agriculture or engineering. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Hunter Crawford.***

#### **CHS Alumni Scholarship**

The Clarinda High School Class of 1962 established the CHS Alumni Scholarship Fund in the fall of 2017. Shortly after the establishment of the fund the CHS Class of 1967 followed suit with a contribution to the fund. This fund was established to provide CHS alumni a manner in which to contribute back to their alma mater for the purpose of awarding scholarships to graduating seniors planning to pursue a post-secondary education at a trade/vocational school, community college or university. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Madolyn Clark.***

#### **CLARINDA VETERANS SCHOLARSHIP**

The Clarinda Veterans Scholarship Fund was established by a group of local veterans to provide tuition aid for the post-secondary education for one or more Clarinda and/or South Page graduating seniors that plan to enroll at an accredited technical/vocational school or college and is

a descendent of a U.S. veteran. ***\$1,000 scholarships were awarded to: Anna Chambers; Madolyn Clark; Maicy Darrah; Grace Moheng; and Carly Rahn. An additional scholarship was awarded in memory of Larry Maxwell who graduated from the Clarinda High School in 1966. Larry was drafted into the United States Marines in 1969 and served through 1971. He was stationed in Okinawa for 11 months and 24 days. Larry passed away on February 4, 2018 with memorials directed to the Clarinda Veterans Fund held with Clarinda Foundation. This \$2,000 scholarship was awarded to Jesse Espinosa.***

#### **CLASS OF 1954**

The Clarinda High School Class of 1954 began building their scholarship at the time of their 50<sup>th</sup> class reunion in 2004. Since then they have been active in supporting an annual scholarship to a CHS senior who has exemplified leadership and a desire to continue their education. ***The \$500 was awarded to Joseph Roshto.***

#### **CLASS OF 1965 SCHOLARSHIP**

The Class of 1962 began building their scholarship in 2015 at the time of their 50<sup>th</sup> Class Reunion. This scholarship is specifically for a graduating senior of the Clarinda High School that plans to enroll at IWCC-Clarinda Campus. Class members felt appreciative of what IWCC had provided to them and thought this was the manner in which they wanted to give back. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Anna Chambers.***

#### **EVELYN HERZBERG EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP**

Evelyn Herzberg established the Evelyn Herzberg Educational Scholarship as a way in which she can give back to the community that she is so proud of. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Paige Sunderman.***

#### **GLENN MILLER VETERANS OF FOREIGN WAR SCHOLARSHIP**

The Glenn Miller VFW Post # 9230 sold their building in April 2013 due to the expense of keeping the building up. The sale proceeds were donated to several good causes, with one of those being the establishment of the Glenn Miller Veterans of Foreign Wars Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to those who are descendants of a veteran of a foreign war. ***The three \$500 scholarships were awarded to Madolyn Clark; Jesse Espinosa; and Grace Moheng.***

#### **DARRELL & MARY HUTCHINSON VOCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP**

The Darrell and Mary Hutchinson Vocational Scholarship was established by Mary Renshaw Hutchinson in memory of her husband Darrell after his death in May 2005. ***The \$2,000 scholarship was awarded to Brodee Means.***

#### **HUGH LOUDON AGRICULTURAL OR BUSINESS SCHOLARSHIP**

In 2009 Bank Iowa Clarinda established a perpetual memorial scholarship to honor its past bank President Hugh Loudon who passed away in 2008. Hugh graduated from the Clarinda High School in 1929, Clarinda Junior College in 1931 and Creighton University in 1933 with a business degree. Hugh joined Citizens Bank (now Bank Iowa Clarinda) in 1957 as Vice President. He later served as President and the Chairman of the Board, formally retiring in 2002 on his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday. ***The \$2,000 scholarship was awarded to Sadie Graham.***

#### **HAROLD & DALE MCKINLEY EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP**

This scholarship was established in Harold and Dale's memory by their children Kenneth McKinley, Susan McKinley Oakes and Mary Anne McKinley Gibson. This scholarship is to be awarded to an individual that graduated from either Clarinda or South Page and will be enrolled in their junior or

senior year of college pursuing a major in primary or secondary education. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Abigail Brown who is a 2015 CHS graduate that is a current student at the University of Northern Iowa where she is majoring in English Teaching.***

**GEORGE MCNEES SCHOLARSHIP WILL BE PRESENTED BY EMILY PROUTY**

In 2017 Martha McNees established the George McNees Memorial Scholarship in memory of her husband. George served his country in the Army from 1953-1955. George retired from the Clarinda Post Office as a window clerk in 1989 after 24 years of service and became a full-time farmer. This scholarship is for a student that is eligible to attend a college or university and plans to major in agriculture or business. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Sadie Graham.***

**NORM MIER SCHOLARSHIP**

The Norm Mier Scholarship was established in his memory by his family to assist a Clarinda High School graduating senior who is pursuing a degree in higher education. Norm was a 1970 graduate of the Clarinda High School and a 1974 graduate of South Dakota State University. In 1978 his love of farming brought him back to Clarinda to farm with his father. In addition to farming, Norm was a full-time bus driver and enjoyed driving to all of the sporting events and cheering on the Clarinda teams. ***The \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Joslynn Williams.***

**SWISHER FAMILY VOCATIONALSCHOLARSHIP**

Jack and Bobbi Swisher established this fund because education has always been very important to them. The Swishers recognize that a 4-year college is not for everyone so they chose to establish a vocational scholarship to assist those students that plan to attend a trade or vocational school. ***The \$2,000 scholarships were awarded to: Megan Goecker; Brodee Means; Joseph Roshto; and Austin Wagaman.***
