



Linderman Hotel
Clarinda, Iowa

The Linderman Hotel was built in 1881 on the Northwest Corner of the Square, and was named for Charles Linderman, a native of New York who moved to Clarinda in 1859 to open a law practice. Mr. Linderman became a major property owner, and served as the Clerk of District Court from 1859 to 1862. In 1865 he was elected to the Iowa House. Naming the hotel after him was an honor bestowed upon the "most representative and most esteemed citizen." The hotel was destroyed by fire in 1886, but was rebuilt by a group of Clarinda investors. In 1963, the hotel was sold and became The Coachman Inn, which it remained until 1977 when it was torn down to make way for a drive-thru bank.
