

Clarinda Foundation officials are encouraging parents, 2016 graduating seniors and post-graduates to go the Foundation's website [www.clarindafoundation.com](http://www.clarindafoundation.com) to view the 2016 Scholarship Descriptions for those scholarships administered by the Clarinda Foundation.

Scholarships that are new for 2016 include:

- CHS Class of 1965 scholarship has been established by class alumni for the purpose of awarding a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 to a CHS graduating senior that plans to attend Iowa Western Community College Clarinda Campus.
- Dr. Willard G. Kuehn Memorial Scholarship has been established by the Kuehn Family in memory of Dr. Kuehn. Dr. Kuehn established his medical practice in Clarinda in 1949. He served in the United States Navy as a medical officer on the USS Sperry in San Diego, California, 1952-1954 during the Korean Conflict. After serving in the Navy he returned to his medical practice in Clarinda until he retired in 1989. Dr. Kuehn was an active member of the community, supporting Clarinda in many ways. He served for fifteen years on the Clarinda Community School Board, was a member of the Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Nodaway Valley Museum Board since its establishment. This scholarship will be awarded in the amount of \$1300 and will only be available for 2016.
- Harold and Dale McKinley Education Scholarship has been established in their memory by their children Kenneth McKinley, Susan McKinley Oakes and Mary Anne McKinley Gibson. This scholarship will be awarded to a graduate of the Clarinda High School or South Page High School, who is entering his/her junior or senior year in an accredited college or university and pursuing a major in primary or secondary education, with special consideration based on need, scholarly achievement, character and reputation.

Harold graduated from Amity High School in College Springs in 1932, and received a Bachelor of Science Degree from Monmouth College, Monmouth, Illinois in 1936. Harold taught junior high mathematics for 20 years (1959-1979) in the South Page and Clarinda Community School Districts.

Dale graduated from high school in Sparta, Illinois in 1935, and she attended Monmouth College, Illinois from 1935-1937. Dale taught at a country school in Randolph County, Illinois from 1935-1937. Once in Page County Dale taught in the South Page and Clarinda School systems from 1960 until her retirement in 1980.

- Patsy Martin Scholarship has been established by her husband Ed and children Holly and Chuck. The \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded to a Clarinda High School graduating senior who is pursuing a degree in English, particularly teaching or writing.

Patsy graduated from Shenandoah High School in 1960 and attended University of Northern Iowa where she graduated from with a Bachelor's Degree in 1964. Patsy taught Junior English in Charles City, Iowa from 1964 until 1966. She began teaching 9<sup>th</sup> grade English in the fall of 1966 and continued until her retirement in 2007.

Other scholarships the Clarinda Foundation administers include:

- Vernon J. Baker Educators' Scholarship will award two \$1,000 scholarships to CHS graduating seniors planning to pursue a degree in higher education at an accredited college or university.
- Ralph & Gladys Borden Memorial Scholarship will award two \$3,000 scholarships per year to a Bedford graduating senior and one to a CHS graduating senior who reside within the boundaries of the former New Market School District. This scholarship is renewable for up to a total of eight semesters based on the student's continued college performance.
- Ethel Brockman Nursing Scholarship will award one \$500 scholarship to either a CHS or South Page graduating senior planning to pursue a degree in higher education with the intent to become a registered nurse.
- Class of 1954 Scholarship will award one \$500 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior or post-graduate.
- Glenn Miller Veterans of Foreign Wars Scholarship will award two \$500 scholarships to either CHS or South Page graduating seniors who are descendants of a veteran of a foreign war and who are pursuing a degree in higher education.
- Darrell and Mary Hutchinson Vocational Scholarship will award one \$2,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior planning to continue his/her education toward a vocational career.
- Hugh Loudon Agricultural/Business Scholarship will award one \$2,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior planning to pursue a vocation in agriculture or business.
- Maxine S. Loudon Scholarship will award one \$2,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior planning to obtain a degree in secondary education with an emphasis in the humanities.
- Norm Mier Memorial Scholarship will award one \$1,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior who is pursuing a degree in higher education.
- Bill O'Riley Business Scholarship will award two \$500 scholarships to CHS graduating seniors (one male and one female) planning to pursue a degree in business at Northwest Missouri State University.
- Robert and Irene Renshaw Education Scholarship will award one \$2,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior who plans to continue his/her education at a four-year college majoring in education.
- Robert and Irene Renshaw Vocational Scholarship will award one \$1,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior who plans to pursue a vocational certificate at a qualified vocational school.
- Dorothy J. and Harry Salomon Scholarship will award one \$500 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior or a post-graduate who is pursuing a degree in higher education at an accredited college or university.

- Swisher Family Vocational Scholarship will award one \$1,000 scholarship to a CHS graduating senior planning to continue his/her education toward a vocational career.
